





Bay Area Unemployment Rates as of Dec 2014








The Labor Testing Model

Other Ways the Orders Help Business

 2. Pre-Registration will allow more portability of employees

3. OPT is like a "Temporary Green Card"

How big could the OPT expansion be?...

Expansion of OPT Employment Authorization (for Recent Graduates of US Universities)

President's Order says to explore expansion "For STEM and other degreed programs"

- Range: Include MBAs and Business Degrees?
 Economics? BS in Sales first job of most CEOs
- Years: Imagine if a recent grad could get 5 years (instead of 1 year and maybe another 17 months)
 How many more outliers would THIS attract?

What Only Congress Can Do

- Overhaul the immigration process (merit-based system)
- "Staple" green cards to STEM and other US diplomas
- Create a Trusted Employer program (streamlined I-140 Immigrant Petitions, etc.)
- Reduce the Immigrant Visa backlog by not counting dependents against the cap
- Authorize more
 H-1B visa numbers!





Education and Poverty Levels

Foreign-Born

- 28% Bachelor's degree
- 31% No HS diploma

US-Born

- 29.4%
- 10%
- Foreign-born = 12% of US population and 16% of workforce
- But 31% of children living in poverty in US are immigrants' kids



Who Gets Green Cards?

About 1M green cards are given a year

990,553 in 2013:

40% born in Asia (China, India, Phillippines...)

32% born in North America (Mexico, DR...)

Only 15% are employment (skill) based!

66% Family-sponsored

15% Refugee/Asylee

4% Diversity Lottery






